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Bowles Captures First Win for Propane-Powered Mustang

LIVONIA, Mich. – Donnie Bowles can add another item to his growing list of accomplishments as he became the first driver on the ROUSH® Drag Team to take one of the liquid propane-powered Mustangs to a victory. His win came during the August 29 elimination rounds of the 4th Annual NMCA Muscle Car Nationals at Milan (Mich.) Dragway.

"It was very satisfying to get the first win for the ROUSH Powered by Propane Drag Team. My teammate Susan (Roush-McClenaghan) and I have both gone to final rounds this year, but haven't quite been able to close the deal until this weekend at Milan. It required a total team effort, as we faced our share of challenges on Sunday. "

Bowles currently leads the NMCA Open Comp point standings and races a 2005 ROUSH Stage 3™ Mustang which was converted during the off-season to run on liquid propane. This car, along with a 2010 ROUSH Stage 3 driven by teammate Susan Roush-McClenaghan, are an offshoot of the kits that ROUSH Performance uses to convert gasoline-powered Ford pickups and vans to run on clean-burning propane.

Both cars use an all-aluminum 5.4L, V-8 Ford engine that was originally designed for the Ford GT supercar. This engine is naturally-aspirated with a 12.5:1 compression ratio. Several other changes were required to run on liquid propane, including CNC ported cylinder heads, high performance camshaft and valvetrain, and a wet sump lubrication system, all of which helps these liquid propane-power engines to generate in excess of 700 horse-power.

"The liquid propane fuel injected engines performed flawlessly throughout the weekend and were the picture of consistency over a wide variety of changing weather conditions. Consistency and reliability are the keys to success in this form of racing and these liquid propane-powered engines continue to prove themselves and demonstrate the technology is viability within the severe-duty environment of competitive drag racing," Bowles said.

Despite popular misconceptions, propane is actually very safe to use as a motor fuel and has a significantly lower flammability than gasoline. It is also good in cool or hot weather making it ideal for motorsports applications. Propane is the third most popular motor fuel (behind gasoline and diesel), and there are already more than 12 million propane-fueled vehicles on roads across the world. As a green fuel, on average propane fleet vehicles reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 19 percent and create 20 percent fewer nitrogen oxides, up to 60 percent less carbon monoxide, and fewer particulate emissions, as compared to gasoline.

Bowles has several companies involved in his program that helped get him to the winner's circle including: ROUSH Competition Engines, Mickey Thompson Tires and Wheels, Moroso Performance Products, McLeod Racing, Kooks Custom Headers, Comp Cams/F.A.S.T., Long/G-Force, Moser Engineering, and Ford Racing-Matukas Motorsports Race Cars.

Ford's Trick TracKey for the 2012 Mustang Boss 302

Ford says the idea behind the TracKey, an ignition key that alters the engine management system in the 2012 Mustang Boss 302 to turn it into a street-illegal racecar, came during an all-night brainstorming session between Mustang team members. I wonder how many Bond movies they watched that night.

The TracKey, introduced this week, looks like a normal ignition key for the coming Mustang Boss 302, except there's a bit of red in the middle. When it's in the ignition, it alters more than 200 parameters in the car's engine management system. The Mustang Boss 302 is already a beast of a car, with 444 horsepower. In TracKey mode, it becomes a track-ready racecar, with higher low-end torque and two-stage launch control.

"From an engine management standpoint, we've done just about everything possible to give TracKey users a full racecar experience," said Jeff Seaman, the Mustang's powertrain engineer, in a statement. "It's not for use on the street – for example, the deceleration is set up to preserve the brakes, and the throttle response is very aggressive. A skilled driver on a closed course will really appreciate the benefits."

Dave Pericak, the Mustang's chief engineer, added, "Anything that could possibly affect all-out performance is deleted from the TracKey calibration. Throttle limiting and torque management — any daily driveability enhancements are removed and replaced with a pure Ford Racing competition calibration."

Ford did not reveal pricing on the TracKey. But to further entice buyers, the automaker also announced a <u>Track Attack program</u>, essentially a complimentary driving instruction/track time at Miller Motorsports Park in Tooele, Utah, for anyone who buys the Mustang Boss 302. More details are expected early next year.



Directions to Jeff and Carrie's



From Denver, take I-25 North to exit 229 which is the Brighton, Lafayette exit onto Highway 7. Turn right and proceed to the furthest left lane to take a left in approx 100 yards. Turn left onto 168th avenue directly across from Village Inn and Gunther Toodys. Continue east on 168th Ave/ Road 2 for 4 miles to Road 17. Make a left onto Road 17 (Dirt Road) and continue North for ½ mile to 479 County Road 17. There is a black mailbox with white flames next to the driveway. This is marked with the red "A" bubble in the map above. The driveway will be on your left with the house sitting 1200' from the road.

Most GPS devices show the address as 479 CR 17 Brighton, CO 80603.

It will be dark with the time change, but the signs are pretty good. I will try to have some balloons on the sign for Road 17 and on the mail box. Any problems, please call.

If coming via Highway 85 through Brighton, take Highway 85 to Highway 7 (where the round abouts are). Take Highway 7 West 5 miles to Quebec street (by the big water tank). Take Quebec north 1 mile to the stop sign, turn left onto 168th/Road 2 and make an immediate right onto Road 17. Proceed ½ mile North to 479 County Road 17.
